PEACE IS NOT ELUSIVE

"My love shall never leave you, nor my covenant of peace be shaken...." Isaiah 54" 10

On a global level and expanse we are inundated through the hysterical news media of violence abounding among nations, schools, marketplaces, houses of worship and places of family leisure. Is there no place safe? Certainly there is no place "sacred"! In naievity we wonder about the "peace" that God promises to His people and whose evidence is but illusionary. Almighty God has tasked us to seek and employ peace in our delibetations, decisions and activities. Nothing less suffices to satisfy the Will of God. This is not impossible at all. Each time we opt for forgiveness instead of revenge or retaliation we are opting for peace. We can create a just world, a happy environment and a peaceful co-existence with God and our fellow man. Let's promote peace wherever there is evidence or semblance of discord, be it, at home, work, relationship or soul searching. Let's all invest in God's promise of peace and apply it to allat all times and under all circumstances. He will tolerate no less! Keep the 'promise' and foster peace.
