## First Sunday of the Great Fast SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY

Blessed are you, O Lord, the God of our fathers. Verse: For you are just in all you have done.
the reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Hebrews 11:24-26, 32-40
Brethren, by faith Moses, when he was grown up, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to share ill-treatment with the people of God than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. He considered abuse suffered for the Christ greater wealth than the treasures of Egypt, for he looked to the reward.
And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets -- who through faith conquered kingdoms, enforced justice, received promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign enemies to flight. Women received their dead by resurrection. Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and scourging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, ill-treated -- of whom the world was not worthy -- wandering over deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, though well attested by their faith, did not receive what was promised, since God had foreseen something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

TOMORROW: MARCH $25^{\text {th }}$ is a double header holiday and holy day! It is the Feast of the Holy Annunciation of Archangel Gabriel to the Blessed Virgin Mary declaring the sacred conception of the LOGOS INCARNATE (Christ Jesus). Note that exactly 9 months from this day we celebrate the NATIVITY of the LORD - December $25^{\text {th }}$.

## Icons Show the Human Face of God

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& \text { In recent months my Sunday reflections have } \\
& \text { frequently focused on our Christian brothers } \\
& \text { and sisters of the East. Wishing as it were to } \\
& \text { embrace their rich tradition of faith in a single } \\
& \text { glance, today I would like to refer once again to } \\
& \text { the sense of mystery which is apparent in their } \\
& \text { icons. The East and the West vie with each other } \\
& \text { to put their art at the service of the faith. } \\
& \text { But from the East, where icons had to be de- } \\
& \text { fended with bloodshed in the iconoclast crisis of } \\
& \text { the eighth and ninth centuries, comes a particu- } \\
& \text { lar call jealously to preserve the religious nature } \\
& \text { of this art. It is based on the mystery of the In- } \\
& \text { carnation, in which God chose to assume a hu- } \\
& \text { man face. In the last analysis, sacred art seeks to } \\
& \text { transmit something of the mystery of that face. } \\
& \text { This is why the East firmly insists on the spiri- } \\
& \text { tual qualities which must characterize the artist, }
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to whom Simeon of Thessalonica, the great defender of Tradition, addresses this important exhortation: "Teach with words, write with letters, paint with colors, in conformity with Tradition; the painting is true, as is the writing of books; and the grace of God is present in them, because what is represented there is holy."

By contemplating icons in the whole context of liturgical and ecclesial life, the Christian community is called to grow in its experience of God, and to become more and more a living icon of the communion of life between the Three Divine Persons.
